SUMMER SCHOOL PROGRAM

F Policy

High School students with a minimum average of less than 50 must take a studies skills course in addition to the course(s) the student has failed. A student will be identified as having below a 50 average by an "F" grade on the report card.

Junior High School Courses

Junior High School ELA/Social Studies students are a combined class with a specialized study skill component regardless of their academic average. There will be separate Science and Math classes. **Math 7 & 8** classes target the essential Grade Level Expectations through self-paced computer-assisted instruction. **These are the only offering at the Junior High School level.**

Private Tutoring Policy

Parents wishing to have their child privately tutored for academic credit must complete an application for summer make-up work by private tutoring. Applications are available in the guidance counselor's office at every school. Private tutors **MUST** hold RI certification in the curriculum area in which make-up work is being done. **Any private tutor wishing to tutor in study skills, Junior High classes, ELA, or math/science MUST** attend a Warwick Public Schools sponsored training session.

Digital Portfolio Entries

High school students taking ELA and/or Math are **required to complete one digital portfolio assignment** as part of their Summer School curriculum. High School ELA courses will focus on pre-research, MLA format, and response to informational text.

ATTENDANCE

The summer school policy on attendance places responsibility on parents and students. Since summer school covers a great amount of material in a short time, **ATTENDANCE and PUNCTUALITY will be EXPECTED.**

Students are allowed one unexcused absence during the summer school session. Two times tardy to school will be counted as an unexcused absence. **Absence and/or tardiness to school can result in dismissal from the summer program.**

ACHIEVEMENT

Warwick students have the opportunity to raise a failing or unsatisfactory grade to a passing grade. The grades are recorded at the student's regular school. **All summer school grades are final.**

REPORTS AND EXAMS

Students enrolled in make-up courses will receive a mid-term progress report. Final examinations will be administered on the last two days of summer school. Final report cards will be mailed to students one week after summer school ends.

STUDENT ELIGIBILITY

Students must be recommended for summer school by the school principal. Eligibility is based on academic and attendance information. **Students must present a signed eligibility letter at the time of registration.**

Students who successfully complete the appropriate courses will be recommended for promotion. These subjects will focus on teaching study skills while reinforcing and remediation. **Math 7 & 8** classes target the essential Grade Level Expectations through self-paced computer-assisted instruction. The courseware identifies students' strengths and weaknesses allowing the teacher to focus on their individual needs.
